The HEPMP project teams took note of the reasons behind that assessment and made significant progress in ensuring that all project outputs are visible and clearly connected with project activities.

I would like to provide you with additional information you requested in hopes of showing that we are well on track with our project activities. Following the reception of the EACEA feedback I made sure that all partners receive it and provide their own comments to it. We also organised the Board Meeting on 27th and 28th of September to, among other, reflect on our implemented activities in light of the EACEA feedback and receive to a feedback of the External Evaluator who evaluated our activities and outputs and provided us with her feedback.

First of all, I would like to ensure you that all of our outputs will be published on the Erasmus+ Project Results Platform. We also plan to send the Request for Payment and Statement for the Costs incurred as the documents are being drafted.

The work plan has been updated and is attached to this email. Please note that this is an outcome of an exercise conducted during the last Board Meeting and is the output of all project partners.

Regarding the progress in the Work Package 3 I would like to report that significant progress has been made while the website includes all relevant information in a separate segment dedicated to <u>LLL courses</u>. Please note that each course was heavily disseminated among professionals and is being followed by the promotional flyer, agenda and advertised on the HEPMP project website as well as institutional websites.

The University of Belgrade implemented the <u>first LLL course</u> on Chronic Pain in March 2019, while the <u>second LLL</u> course Radiotherapy modalities for pain management is to be implemented on 17th October 2019 at the Institute for Oncology and Radiology, Belgrade, Serbia.

The University of Kragujevac <u>one LLL course</u> on Acute pain and is preparing practicum *Pain Medicine* that will be published by the end of 2019. The second and the third LLL courses for primary care physicians will be accredited in October 2019. The manual in *Pain Therapy* to be used for the upcoming LLL courses covering that topic was developed and will be printed in November 2019.

In 2020 the following LLL courses will be accredited and implemented by the UNIKG team:

- The LLL course in pain medicine for primary care physicians
- The accreditation of LLL course for primary care physicians
- The implementation of LLL course for primary care physicians
- The implementation of highly specialized courses for interventional pain management
- The implementation of LLL course for primary care physicians

The University of Tuzla accredited and implemented the LLL course in <u>Acute pain</u> – significance and treatment by the Medical Chamber. It was also video streamed so that it reaches the highest number of health professionals and disseminated via local TV station.

The University of Banja Luka accredited and implemented two LLL courses: <u>Acute pain</u> and <u>Chronic pain</u>.

The University of Montenegro: the first course in palliative medicine is planned for November 2019, while the rest of LLL courses will be implemented in 2020.

Regarding the **equipment** taking into account your acknowledgment that the equipment has been purchased for both HEIs in Serbia, I would like to report that the **University of Belgrade** and the **University of Kragujevac** are already utilising equipment for teaching students. The **University of Tuzla** met some obstacles in purchasing equipment as the new government was to be formed that stopped all purchases over the central vault system. This fact hindered the equipment purchase for **both Bosnian HEIs**. However, I am happy to report that all the obstacles were successfully overcame and the equipment had been purchased and installed at both universities. The **University of Montenegro** also completed the equipment purchase. Please note that the slight delay will not hinder the implementation of the project activities as students enrolled in modernised study programmes will have the equipment at their disposal from the first day of their studies.

Please find enclosed to this report a revised version of the Quality Assurance and control manual with measurable indicators.

Even though it was not envisaged by the project application (as the HEPMP application envisages that the external expert conducts the monitoring and evaluation of the work of Quality Control board, as well as Management board and he implementation of the deliverables of work packages that are shown in the logical framework) we took note of your additional request and asked our external evaluator to look into the content of the new study programmes and their effectiveness in connection to employability of the future graduates. While we regret to see that it was not clear from the progress report that the modernised curriculum is fully in line with the latest developments in the pain medicine in the EU and that you feel that additional expertise is needed I have to state that the HEPMP project consortium has no doubt in our Programme Country partners when it comes with the quality of their expertise. Still, we did ask our external evaluator to look into the employability of the graduates. The summary of the Expert's findings (more further elaborated in the report produced for and presented at the Board Meeting in September 2019) that were, among other, based on the output of the Tempus project CONGRAD that conducted a survey on graduates in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro and Serbia and looked into their employment and overall employability of graduates, is that medical graduates are primarily and predominantly employed by the state with limited possibilities for fresh graduates to be employed in the private sector which implies that any intervention aiming at increasing the employment opportunities in this sector would have to be significantly larger than an intervention into curriculum and LLL courses. When it comes to employability of graduates, where this project aims at intervening, the fact that it does ether develop curricula on undergraduate and postgraduate level or it modernises relevant study programmes in order to encompass the latest developments in pain medicine in Europe backed by the Programme Country partners, ensures the significant increase in employability of graduates and the overall quality of their future work. The impact of the project should not be neglected when it comes at increasing knowledge and skills of medical professionals through LLL courses which will live long after project ends.

The project forum available on the project website is going to be vastly disseminated in the second half of the project by all project partners.

Our project partners are making sure to disseminate the project information on their websites.

Regarding the impact of the implemented study programmes and in addition to the WP2 table, please note that the intervention in curricula includes both undergraduate and postgraduate students so we cannot but disagree with the assessment that our project lacs impact. The modernisation of undergraduate study programmes and intervention into Surgery curricula (at UBG but also UNIKG and UNITZ and UNIBL) will ensure that students facing the need to apply knowledge from pain medicine will be equipped to do so. While we cannot influence the number of medicine students that are studying at partner HEIs we can and we are ensuring that the coverage of students is at the highest possible level. The number of students included in the modernised study programmes is significantly higher than 10 as only at the University of Belgrade modernised courses on the undergraduate level at the 5th year of medical studies attend 500 students. Also, intervention in postgraduate courses (i.e. the modernisation of subspecialisation) additionally increases the impact of the project and ensures that postgraduates receive knowledge that is much needed in their field.

Regarding the involvement of the non-academic partners, two courses are planned to be held at the Clinical Hospital Center Dr Dragiša Mišović. Colleagues from the participating Programme countries will be speakers at those courses aiming at increasing internal capacities of the Hospital that will later be in position to pass that knowledge to other medical professionals and medicine students. As direct consequence of the Centre's participation a Centre for Pain will be established within the Hospital that will start working in 2020.

During the preparation of the first course in Banja Luka the HEPMP project team had the support of a pharmaceutical company that sponsored the printing of a handbook on acute pain. In the future, this activity may also be supported by a letter of intent if the pharmaceutical company has this in its business rules. Associated partners participated through the organisation of trainings and LLL courses for their doctors by the HEPMP project partners. All project partners are working on connecting with pharmaceutical companies to increase the employability of graduates through that cooperation. The memorandums of understanding are being negotiated from the start of the second half of the project.
